


TORONTO SECTOR SKILLS ACADEMY

improving the quality of low-wage jobs


2. Building Ladders:

- Have support from supervisor approving participation in the TSSA
- Commit to full participation in all events and retreats

- 2. Ability / Authority to Implement
- 3. Applicability of Sector Skills Learning
 - Organizational Capacity to Implement
- 4. Partnering Skills / Vision
- 5. Commitment to Social Justice
- 6. References

- Application deadline: November/December 2020
- TSSA is composed of:
 - Three 3-day retreats
 - Retreat 1: Spring 2021
 - Retreat 2: Summer 2021
 - Retreat 3: Fall 2021
 - Three events/workshops in Toronto
 - Welcome Reception
 - Toronto workshop (2 days)
 - Closing presentation/graduation December 2021
